## Summer Session June 2 - July 23, 2025

In order to determine eligibility for the summer 2025 semester, you must complete the appropriate year's FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). The FAFSA is available on the web at <u>studentaid.gov</u>.

**PELL GRANTS** – With the implementation of "year-round Pell", you may have eligibility from either the 2024-2025 FAFSA or the 2025-2026 FAFSA. Therefore, the Financial Aid Office recommends that you **file both the 2024-2025 & 2025-2026 FAFSA forms** to determine which application offers grant eligibility in your best interest. Credit enrollment requirements may differ depending on which year's FAFSA provides summer Pell eligibility.

**LOANS** – Federal Direct Loans may be available if you have not exhausted your maximum annual loan limit eligibility during the fall 2024 and spring 2025 semesters (from the 2024-25 FAFSA only). Direct loans require a minimum enrollment of at least 6.0 credit hours during the summer 2025 semester, and a Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Loan Entrance Counseling (if you are a first-time loan borrower). If you have not already done so in a previous term, complete:

- Entrance Loan Counseling at studentaid.edu

- MPN at studentaid.edu

NOTE: Because of the variability of course start dates and the possibility of course/section cancellations, your aid may not be available in one disbursement. The Financial Aid Office will notify you in your Financial Aid Offer Letter of the dates and amounts of financial aid disbursements available to you. Additionally, to receive summer funding you must successfully meet the standards as established in the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) policy. Review the policy at nwc.edu/fapolicy.

- B. an employee of the Federal Emergency Management Agency who is performing official duties of the Agency in an area, if those official duties— I. are related to a major disaster or emergency that has been, or is later, declared to exist with respect to the area under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.); and
  - II. are determined by the Director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to be hazardous duties;
- C. an employee of a State, local, or tribal emergency management or civil defense agency who is performing official duties in cooperation with the Federal Emergency Management Agency in an area, if those official duties—
  - I. are related to a major disaster or emergency that has been, or is later, declared to exist with respect to the area under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.); and
  - II. are determined by the head of the agency to be hazardous duties; or
- D. a member of a rescue squad or ambulance crew who, as authorized or licensed by law and by the applicable agency or entity, is engaging in rescue activity or in the provision of emergency medical services.
