## CRITERION FIVE – Engagement and Service Steering Committee Meeting Notes 11/18/09

Based on Steering Committee comments, the revised strengths and concerns are as follows:

## Northwest College Prides Itself on

- Effective partnerships with local, state, regional and international entities. Vote: Aye – unanimous.
  - The committee agreed to broaden this bullet by adding regional and international entities.
- Strong relationships with public schools in the service area. Vote: Aye – unanimous.
  - The committee agreed to change the wording of this bullet to "public schools in the service area".
- Making its facilities available for the delivery of education, performances, conferences, recreation and community meetings and gatherings. Vote: Ave unanimous.
  - The committee agreed remove the words "well maintained facilities" and to broaden the statement to include recreation.
- Good communication tools that include award winning student publications, a widely available television station (NWC-TV), and a comprehensive website. Vote: Aye unanimous.
  - There was some discussion of the radio station which could be added when it is up and running.
  - The committee agreed to change the wording from "fully developed website" to "a comprehensive website".
- Articulation agreements that facilitate student mobility to continue progress in degree work.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

- There was no significant discussion on this topic.
- Cultural, multi-cultural, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities that engage the college's various constituencies.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

- The committee agreed to change the wording of this bullet to include "cocurricular and extra-curricular". Virginia and Rob will write a broader theoretical statement in the text of the document to further support this bullet.
- Strong response to the outreach areas through physical centers and distance education.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

• There was no significant discussion on this topic.

• A workforce Development program that works closely with local employers to strengthen the employee base in their communities.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

• There was no significant discussion on this topic.

## Northwest College Challenges Itself to

- Balance the need for services at the outreach centers with available resources. Vote – Aye – unanimous.
  - $\circ$  There was no significant discussion on this topic.
- Continue development of service learning & civic engagement to enhance current student experiential learning opportunities.
  - Vote: Aye unanimous.
  - The committee agreed to highlight what our challenge is by rewording this bullet.
- Better track community use of facilities.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

• The word "community" was added to this bullet.

• Use data more effectively to make decisions regarding constituency engagement & service.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

- Through discussion the committee reworded this bullet making the statement more specific to this criterion.
- Find resources that allow the college to continue providing non-credit workforce training in the absence of an identifiable revenue stream.

Vote: Aye – unanimous.

• The issue is really the absence of identifiable revenue stream. The committee agreed to rephrase the bullet to reflect the difficulty in finding the resources to fund the non-credit workforce training.
