- Close to home- just 30 minutes away -- right size and location -- not too big
- Location and undecided when first started good price point to test drive some classes

• Originally wanted to go to Berkeley, and was already taking college classes as a high school student and had already earned 30 credits - very affordable (she doesn't have to pay other than for books)

Enrolled Students Out of State

- Close to home, livestock judging, program I wanted, and its small.
- I was not planning on going to college after high school. Went to Northwest College because a friend went here. She introduced me to the horse equine program.

International Students

- Scholarship opportunity, initial advisors were fast, answered quickly, since it was a small community, there was good communication. And soccer.
- I spent four years looking at community colleges, my dream schools, animation programs. Then I heard about NWC through the *American Corner*, and some America advisors, also communication with current students. Tuition was affordable. The scholarships and the program I wanted, the course descriptions. Watching the video from the Art Department motivated me to attend. As a visual art student, you want to see what the college does visually.
- I was looking for football, met my needs and expectation. It is the kickoff for my educational journey. My friends sent me some information. What I really liked about NWC is that admissions reached out and answered questions quickly. I did not know about American education and they were very communicative and responsible. Told me information about the college and the college was affordable. Looked at the website, I found about the college's activities. Came for General Studies and changed to engineering. Liked what the international students were doing at the college, how the college worked with international students, and they were very welcoming.
- I was looking for basketball. A friend who was here last year told me about it then I talked to the coach.

- Local. I have kids that have a life and friends here. Staying local was a good thing for me.
- NWC was the only college I wanted to go to. My mother-in-law told me that it was the best bang for the buck.
- Affordability and with the college not being in Cody, some of the rent are more affordable. People in the
 area, it is a good place to start an education. For me, affordability and not too far but far enough, close
 to Billings and Cody. Plus, the medical and nursing programs are top ranking programs in the United
 States. As an allied health major, I plan to get a bachelor's degree.
- NWC was the only college I was considering. Since I lived in Lovell, due to COVID, I was out of work last year. I took the displaced program through Workforce to get a degree. I wanted to have something at the end of the pandemic.

- This is the third college in this past 6 months, due to COVID restrictions. I came here since my family lives here.

- Decided to attend NWC before transferring for engineering



3. If you had not attended NWC, what other alternatives were you considering? What did you consider to be the advantages and disadvantages of each, as compared to attending NWC?

Enrolled Students In-State

- Berkeley NWC was more affordable and I was so close to having my degree -- distance from home -wanted to produce more work at a smaller school -- acceptance rate (almost guaranteed to be admitted).
- UW and the other community colleges especially Sheridan because I had thought about culinary arts -- I did not know what I wanted to do -- Sheridan had an advantage of reputation in culinary world -- Sheridan's price was high compared to other WY institutions. Sheridan was far enough away from home to be independent but close enough to home.
- I was considering going to Black Hills State University but was not ready for the distance. I had prior credits from NWC earned online. Did not want to pay for housing-the price and have a dog, so staying at home was the best for me. I also have a job in Lovell, so it was the perfect option. Some disadvantages where other places the price was SO high. NWC's location was far enough to have the experience and stay home.

Enrolled Students Out of State

- I considered a college in Miles City and some other smaller colleges in the area, some were two or three hours from here. Considered track and field, before of my injury. The advantage of coming here is the Livestock judging, and the show team.
- I was not really planning on going to college. I had consider just going straight to work after high school. The Equine center won me over. NWC has the whole community, small atmosphere on campus.

International Students

- Flathead Community College in Montana. Needed to transfer, advisor recommended. I like the county side and the small size; this is advantage and disadvantage because I must use Uber a lot.
- I had the option to go to Lang Community College in Oregon and Savannah College of Art and Design in Georgia. Also, at a bigger college, I would have to had transportation to get around. I needed to find the right program that would transfer. I also needed technology. I came here by myself, so technology was important to me to communicate. Transportation is an issue for me. I miss having buses like the big cities.
- Kansas. Already had three students that I know went there. The other college advantage was the location, center of the US. Closer to major city, less money for flights. But they did not have as many programs and activities, they did not have engineering, they only had Liberal Arts. I do not really know anything about Liberal Arts. I wanted Engineering. Did not want to be Major-less. Transportation is an issue especially for international students. They used to have transportation between Powell and Cody. For many students living off campus, in the winter it is hard to get to the campus. It would be good to have some need based transportation offered by the school; if someone called, they could pick them up.
- Scholarship. I was thinking about going to college in Nebraska. They only had the soccer scholarship. If I
 went there, I would not have been able to afford to come here. The scholarship helped me come to
 NWC.

Enrolled Adult Students


- I did not have any other colleges in mind.

- So, in the fall I was going to attend the University of Nevada, when the restrictions about COVID came out. I decided it was too expensive to go the University if they were only going to be online. I could go to a community college online where it was less expensive.
- Other schools offered me different scholarships. But it was cheaper to come here with the combination of scholarships, especially for soccer.
- I want to go to Respiratory Therapy School. The only school in WY is in Casper. I can do prerequisites through NWC and do most of the Casper program online and then my clinical in Cody.
- As an international student, I received soccer scholarship offers from 3 other schools. They were all in the South, and I preferred this location.
- I looked at Casper College and plan to transfer there after NWC. Advantage is that it is a 4-year institution. Disadvantage is its location it is too far from home.
- I looked at the University of Colorado in Boulder and plan to transfer there. I was fairly indecisive between CU and NWC but decided on NWC because of the convenient location, and simpler start.
- I selected NWC for the location and program of study.
- NWC was my only option. My family and I are settled down in Cody and don't plan on leaving.

Enrolled Students In-State

- Affordability: Very well -- you pay very little other than books and class materials it is nice to know you will not have to spend a lot. Class size is good. I like the small class size because it makes the class discussion more robust.

Enrolled Students Out of State

- Animal science is great. Labs are awesome. Went to different places around WY. Vet taught different things to help me become better.
- Did not have expectations. But overall, in the Equine program, you get out of it what you put in. I learned more than I thought I would. Hands on experience that you would not get in other places. Classes are small, good to get one-on-one with instructor.

International Students

- Scholarship and tuition. I also focused on the safety and environment. I did not want to be worried about shooting and guns. I like to walk in the middle of the night, and here at NWC, I can walk around and feel safe.
- American students have FAFSA, but for us, there are only certain scholarship opportunities you can get. For example, there are nursing scholarships to get money if you are from here [U.S], but for us, we do not have access to that. I am sure that all of us have applied to all the scholarships every year.
- Scholarships. I spent from my own savings. I have applied for scholarships using my art portfolio. I also applied to be a resident assistant, but then it's hard to manage everything. I stopped because it was too hard to study and work. We [international students] pay way more, more than twice then local students. Also, I was fascinated that my first week, how dedicated the faculty were. They treated us great. They motivated and inspired us. They really try to spend time with each student. Some faculty were great with international students and willing to help us through language barriers. They were extremely dedicated. It depends on personal experiences; I enjoy working with faculty in my class.
- Agree with what everyone else said here. Admission process is very flexible- they want to help you to get the necessary documents to get accepted. With other community colleges, I would spend a month to get papers; here I spent only two weeks, and was accepted within two weeks. They value students. They make us feel important. They give us more attention because they know we want to study here.
- Sports. But it really depends on the coach, as they have a certain amount of money to give for scholarships. For us coming out of the country, we do not have access to normal financial aid. It is rare that we get any money. And international tuition is more expensive.

Enrolled Adult Students

- 10 point out of 10. I am not paying anything out of pocket. My awards are paying the entire cost.
- I have had a very easy time getting scholarships and aid that I needed. They paid in timely manner, there was not any miscommunications. As far as financial goes, it is great.
- I think they are doing well, but back to what was mentioned earlier, there is extra stress. Outside factors that are adding stress. But as far as financial aid and scholarships go, I cannot complain at all.
- My situation was unique. Thirty years ago, I tried to attend at NWC. I guess I had more fun at the time, so when I chose to come back, my books and tuition were paid for by displaced workers workforce program. I did not qualify this year for other aid. I was 18 then, now I am 50, and I did not know that stuff I did 30 years ago would affect my eligibility for aid. So, I took personal loans. Now with my GPA, I should qualify next year. The tuition process was simple, but it took some time to get the books paid for not sure if it was the college or the Workforce program that I am in.



- I feel on my own at the college sometimes feel completely alone finding out info I need. Felt the same way In high school. They did not have announcements his friends helped him navigate the process.
- If I had not had the help of TRIO, I would have been lost and frustrated.
- I applied for scholarships and had to answer an uncomfortable question "why I deserve the scholarship more than others."
- I had difficulty in navigating the process and understanding how things work at other institutions I would go to other institutions' admissions and just get a vague idea of what I needed to do. What got me interested in college was the veteran's benefits, and I wanted to use those. NWC made it very easy to get my benefits and get enrolled.
- I must have a degree to move up in my career. It was "super easy" to get enrolled at NWC. Admissions and student advisors were awesome. I am first gen and TRIO has been terrific professors so far have been super helpful could not ask for a better place.
- Having online courses makes it easy to do school from home I don't have to find babysitters I appreciate the ease to do this program online.
- NWC came up on my Facebook timeline and that got me interested in returning to school and going to NWC
- If it wasn't for my sister who helped me go back to school and telling me about scholarships, I would have never known.

I have been involved in Residence Life. I have noticed that students from outside the service area, out of
state and international students, have a hard time with transportation. There is no public transportation
in this area. The college could promote or advertise that there is no public transportation so that
students know this before they decide to come here. Or the college could provide transportation
options for students.

Enrolled Students Out of State

- Not really sure because I don't live on campus.
- I have had a good experience. Do not really have anything that they need to change. I know that the one thing after living there for two years, (it is my third year at the college) but because it a small town, there is not a lot to do outside the college. The transportation is a challenge especially for international students, they have a hard time getting around. International students really have no choice but to live on campus. Both personal transportation and to the campus is a challenge if you do not have a car.

International Students



- To be an international student NWC, you must stay at the housing the first year. This is an advantage and disadvantage because you must stay a year. The time is too long for me. It is noisy with the drill alarm. Alarm goes off every time someone cooks. I would have liked to live somewhere else, but I was not the right age to live off campus.
- Colleges are business oriented, NWC wants students with good GPA. An advantage, the college lets students get a good education. But the faculty are not doing a not great job in programs like welding. They [welding faculty] do not take the student seriously.

Enrolled Adult Students

- As a Photography student, I have had good experiences. I am taking more classes; they have been very accommodating. Having to deal with kids, I have not had any troubles. If I get off work late, they give me an extra day or two. I had heard about how some students are hearing impaired, they have supplied additional teachers to help with that. They have provided professors with clear masks. I think that is cool. What I was saying earlier, if you have special needs, they help you. My professors help me with my essays, since I get off work late, they help me with deadline date extensions. All photography department professors are wonderful, and I would like for them to know that.
- I would like to suggest one thing. It would be good that the college focused on disability staff who are trained in developmental learning, so that students can get their work done. I worked as a special education student. I help students like this. Simple learning tools to help disabled students.
- The hospitality program could be expanded and expand some foreign language opportunities. We take on so many travelers. Hospitality certificates so that we can take care visitors.
- Being more involved. The college faculty and staff should act like they would if we were on campus. I do not have anything to compare it to since I came here after COVID. They want their students to be engaged, but the professors need to be more engaged and guide the class. I can read the PowerPoint that they sent to us three weeks ago. I need more interaction and discussion about the subject. I read the PowerPoint, then they read the PowerPoint in class word for word. Waste of time. Also, I have a class that meets twice a week. That professor has missed three classes. Now, we must make up the work. Three out of twelve seems excessive. If I missed it would be different. If a student misses class, 2-5 % gets taken off our grades. Fall semester [Fall 2020] was very engaging but spring term [Spring 2021], it was like someone pushed the "I don't care button."

- I think that the hardest part is the mix between in person and online. I think it only works when you are either one to the other, asynchronous works better for me. So, like, when the class meets three times a week, and we don't do anything, that is not a good use of my time.
