In addition, you will have to plan for housing and food during some clinical experiences occurring outside the local area. 4<sup>th</sup> semester you will be responsible for the cost of travel to and from Oklahoma City as well as food and lodging while there for a week.

- \*\*\*Course lab fees include a one-time response bag supply replacement fee to be used actively in lab for the two years the student is with us. It also covers other frequent supply usage, such as needles and IVs, and provides the ability for us to facilitate hands-on training as best we can. These fees also cover the cost of the student to obtain certifications that are not part of the paramedic curriculum but are required by many employers to work in the area. These covered courses are: Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Pediatric Advanced Life Support, Emergency Pediatric Care, Neonatal Resuscitation Program, Prehospital Trauma Life Support, Tactical Emergency Casualty Care, and Advanced Wilderness Life Support. Each of these courses alone range from \$200 to \$500.
